

Summary Annual Report

For ILWU-PMA Savings (401(K)) Plan

This is a summary of the annual report for ILWU-PMA Savings (401(K)) Plan, Employer Identification Number 94-1126322, Plan No. 002 for the period July 01, 2021 through June 30, 2022. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Basic Financial Statement

Benefits under the plan are provided through a trust fund. Plan expenses were \$152,235,003. These expenses included \$196,165 in administrative expenses and \$152,035,147 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries and \$3,691 in other expenses. A total of 19082 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$2,441,918,578, as of June 30, 2022 compared to \$2,788,985,409 as of July 01, 2021. During the plan year, the plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of (\$347,066,831) . This decrease includes unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of (\$194,831,828), including employer contributions of \$32,415,368, employee contributions of \$140,017,679, other contributions of \$3,805,845, realized gains of \$12,482,778 from the sale of assets, and losses from investments of (\$383,553,498) .

The plan has contracts with which allocates funds toward individual policies. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending June 30, 2022 were \$0.
