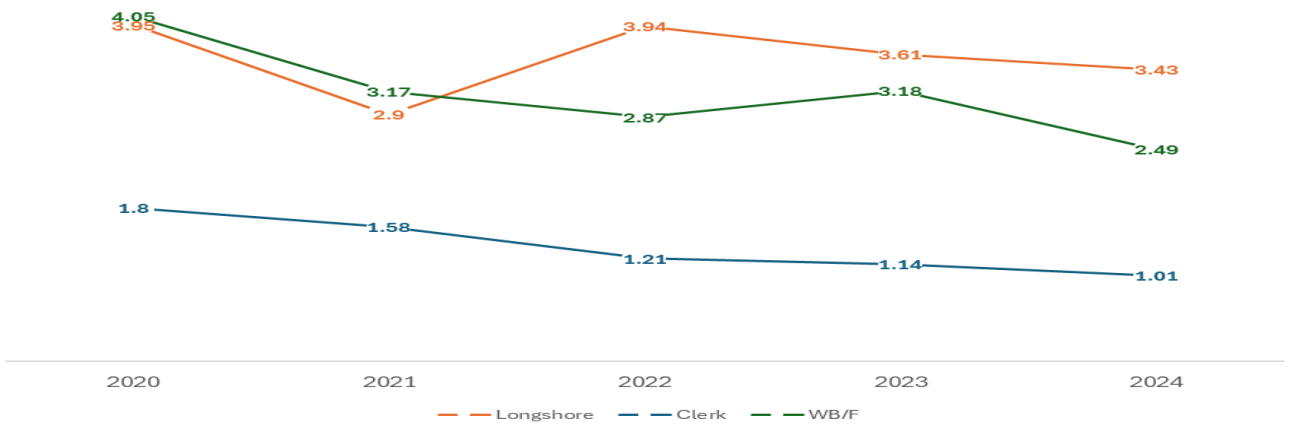
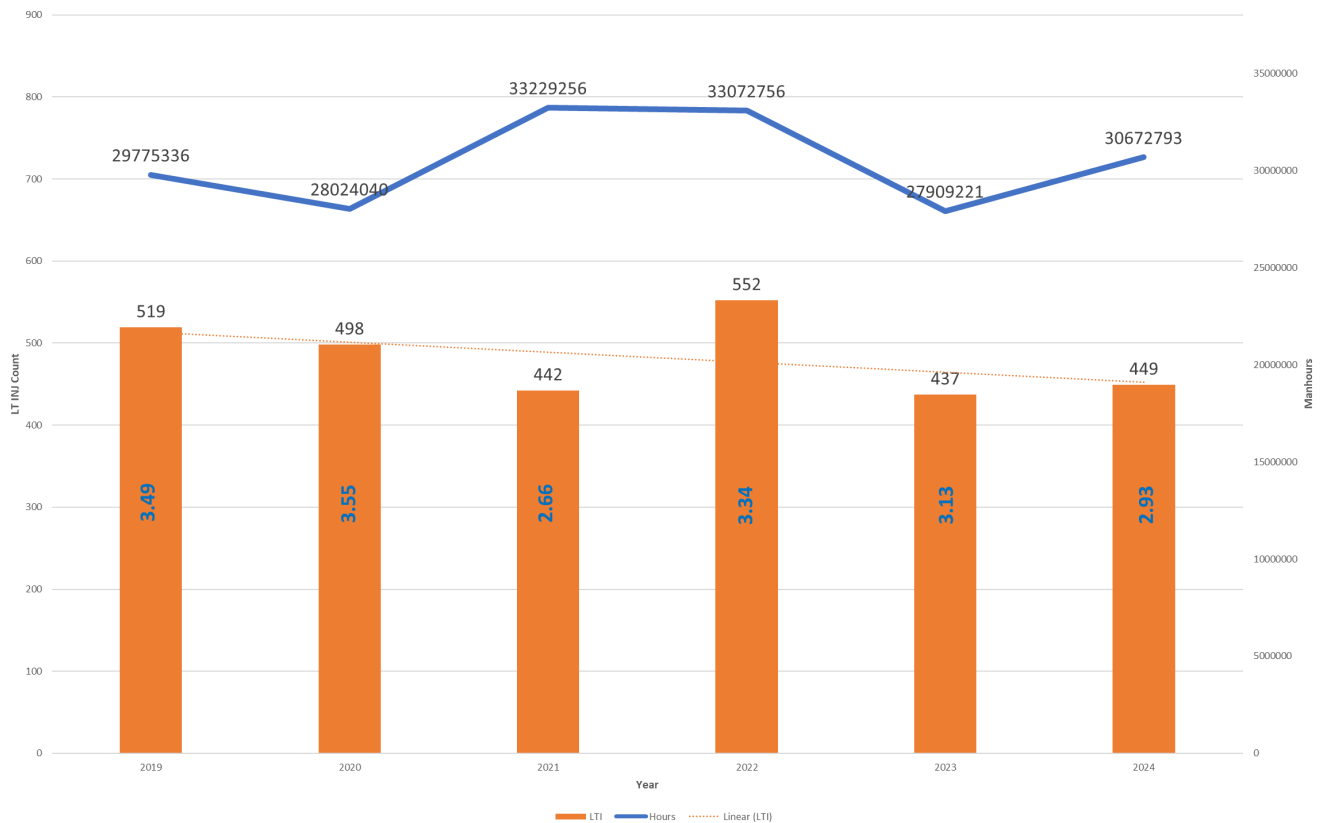


West Coast 2024 Occupational Injury Incidence Rates

The lost-time injury and illness rate is based on OSHA recordkeeping criteria (29 CFR 1904) and is a national standard used to provide an overall indication of injury and illness trends. OSHA has noted that recording a case on the OSHA recordkeeping forms does not indicate either that the employer or the employee was at fault in the incident or that an OSHA rule has been violated.

The formula for the lost time incidence rate includes the number of work related lost time injuries and illness and the total hours worked (exposure) during the calendar year and is based upon a work force of 100 workers each working 2,000 hours per year. Total loss time injuries * 200,000/Hours Rptd.
